### **Mission Statement:**

### **Objectives of SWIFC**

1. To promote the professional interests of Social Workers who work in the area of Foster Care
2. To promote the achievement of the highest professional Social Work standards in the area of Foster Care
3. To develop a strong voice to advocate on behalf of children in Foster Care and to promote their best interests
4. To promote optimal standards for children in Foster Care
5. To highlight the need to actively encourage permanency planning either with their birth family or in care for all children with whom social workers are involved.

6. To nurture the primacy of the fostering dyad (Foster Carer / Foster Child) where it is in the best interest of the child and promote the concept of continuity of care for the child.
7. To promote secure and healthy attachments with a recognition of the developmental needs of children in care.
8. To recognise and promote, the importance of familial bonds, especially with siblings and extended family.
9. To liaise with the IFCA and other fostering organisations at local, national and international level.
10. To establish professional expertise in the area of Fostering from a Social Work perspective. To be available to both governmental and non-governmental agencies as a professional voice in the area of Foster Care.
11. To promote and encourage research and development in all areas of foster care practice. This will include:
  - a. child development
  - b. training methods and materials
  - c. assessment processes, for Foster Carers and children in care
  - d. triadic attachment
  - e. contact and access
  - f. support systems, policies and procedures for both Foster Carers and children
  - g. legal frameworks and national standards
  - h. the principals of permanency
  - i. support systems for Social Workers in Foster Care
12. To establish links with third level colleges and universities in Ireland. To promote specific training in foster care.
