Speakers

Professor Sue White from the University of Lancaster has worked as a practitioner and manager in statutory children's services from 1983 until 1995 when she took up an academic post at the University of Manchester. Her research has focused principally on the analysis of professional decision-making in child welfare, with a particular emphasis on safeguarding. She has recently completed two influential Research Council funded studies. The first focusing on electronic information sharing in multi-disciplinary child welfare practice and the second on the relationship between performance management of public services responsible for safeguarding children, and the impact of anticipated blame within the decision making practices of those providing, supervising and managing these services. Sue is currently a member of the Social Work Task Force, charged with undertaking a comprehensive review of frontline social work practice in England. She is currently Chair of the Association of Professors of Social Work and Editor-in-Chief of *Child and Family Social Work*.

Paul McCarthy is a qualified Social Worker working in Child Welfare in the Dublin area.
