ABOUT THE PROGRAMME:

The programme provides best-practice protocols, along with the practical tools, that support the creation and sustenance of supervisory relationships – enhancing professional and personal lives.

There are six modules which advance deeper dives into the essentials of creating excellent supervision

- 1. The Supervisor's core competencies, roles and responsibilities, and the leadership relational qualities that harness the talents and develop the competencies of our supervisees.**
- 2. The Supervisee's active participation in the co-creation of an effective supervisory process – emphasising self-directed lifelong learning and the quest for growth as crucial requisites for supervisees**
- 3. The models* that guide the supervisory process from the macro view of the supervisee's organisational context and those he/she serves, as well the micro view which provides a structured road map for every individual supervision session (*Tony Morrison's 4x4x4 model 2005; Hawkins & Shohet 1989; Stoltenberg & Delworth 1987; Page & Wosket 1994)**
- 4. Provision of group supervision and other potential delivery methods that allow for the distinction to be made from other roles the supervisor and supervisee may share. (e.g. direct line management, case work management etc.)**
- 5. Working with complexities, ethical dilemmas and other stakeholders whom influence the supervision process**
- 6. Continuing Professional Development which includes dedicated and ongoing attention to our well-being and resilience – the key determinant in our effectiveness as supervisors and practitioners**
